## **Forrest Research Foundation**

- Established 2014

## **Prospect Fellowship benefits:**

- 18 months duration
- Salary: Lecturer Level A, step 8 (approx. AU\$95,000) + superannuation
- Professional development training through the Prospect Development
  Program to accelerate your career
- Inclusion in Forrest Research Foundation seminars and workshops at Forrest Hall
- Mentoring support

## **Eligibility criteria**

- Open to Australian and New Zealand citizens and to Australian permanent residents
- Applicants must have completed all the requirements for the award of their PhD between 1 August 2019 and 14 March 2021 (i.e. examined, corrected and passed by the university)



## Additional application requirements (1):

# Research must be in one of six designated areas of WA research excellence:

- Agriculture, food and nutrition
- Arts and culture
- Environment and natural resources
- Frontier technologies
- Indian Ocean
- Physical and mental health and wellbeing



## Additional application requirements (2):

#### **Candidates must:**

- be based in a research group with an international research reputation, experience of research translation and track record of supporting early-career researchers
- demonstrate potential impact of their research on the WA community, society or economy



## Additional application requirements (3):

#### **Candidates must:**

- have an outstanding personal research track record
- propose an intellectually exciting and innovative research agenda
- be keen to share ideas and work with others
- have excellent communication skills



## What makes an ideal fellowship application?

- Research proposal is accessible to non-experts without being dumbed down
- Demonstrates how proposed research innovates/pushes at boundaries
- Explains how proposed research will generate results/outcomes within 18 months that will be of significance to others both within and beyond the discipline



## How to apply:

- 1. Ask yourself: 'am I one of the very best PhD graduates (top 5%) of the last 5 years?'
- 2. Make sure the evidence in your CV sustains this claim
- 3. Develop an innovative research proposal that does more than simply extend your PhD research
- 4. Discuss proposal with a senior academic mentor and gain their support
- 5. Discuss with proposed host department/research group and ensure they support your application



#### **The Selection Process:**

- 1. Each university produces a long-list of its top applications
- 2. The top 25 or so applications, as ranked by universities, are reviewed by a shortlisting panel of the Selection Committee
- 3. A small number of candidates are short-listed for interview. Short-listed candidates will be asked to provide copies of their PhD Examiners reports
- 4. The Selection Committee seeks expert evaluations from nominated referees, nominated academic mentors, and other independent subject experts.
- 5. All shortlisted candidates are interviewed in person or by videolink FORRESTRESEARCH.ORG.AU
